This is a very sensitive subject but I would be remiss in my duties as mentor and role model not to speak on their behalf. I consider myself fortunate and blessed to have been a Master of San Diego Lodge #35, the most prestigious lodge in San Diego County. To uphold that tradition and be a part of that proud history is what any man who aspires to be in the East wants... if given a chance.
