All of which should comfort us to some degree when we are scared. More than anything, at least for me, I take comfort in knowing that there is a brother out there somewhere that I can call on when and if I am in need and who will be there to help. I don't have to be scared alone.


Also, if you are in the permanent reservation list and are not able to make the dinner, please contact the office and let us know that you will NOT be able to attend the dinner.
