### From The West

Greetings, brethren! .

This past month, I reflected on the rich history of San Diego Lodge No. 35, as captured in the 1942 article "Lodge Has Colorful History of Pioneering, Progress" by Ruth Taunton, published in The San Diego Union-Tribune. The article vividly recounts the first, perhaps informal, meeting of our lodge "One night in June 1851", attended by the men who ultimately signed our petition for dispensation: William C. Ferrell, James W. Robinson (Same Robinson as Robinson House in Old Town), John Judson Ames (founder of the San Diego Herald, San Diego's first newspaper), William H. Moon, Daniel Barbee, W.H. Davis, John Cook, R.F. Raymond

It details the application for dispensation, Grand Lodge approval, our first election, and installation, painting a picture of our lodge's vital role in shaping San Diego through charity and civic leadership. It even talks about the fabled story of us founding the first public school in San Diego. Yet, between the lines, it also reveals the human struggles at that time—turmoil, disharmony, and even J.W. Robinson's struggles with ritual on installation night. Despite these challenges, our lodge

custom probably thousands of years ago. Circumambulation always proceeded sunwise-that is, in the direction assumed to be taken by the sun. we use the term 'clockwise' to explain the same thing, and we speak of the contrary direction as being 'against the sun,' or 'counter clockwise,' while the Scots have their own curious word for it— 'withershins,' or 'widdershins.'

Thousands of years ago people became nervous of proceeding except in the sunwise direction. We read that when Plato, who lived in the 5th century B.C., gave a symposium—a dinner and drinking party—the greatest care was taken to pass the wine cups around from right to left, and even conversation and everything that took place in the entertainment was made to observe that same rule. The superstition was strongly held through the centuries and is often met today.
