The service may be held in a chapel, home, church, synagogue or lodge room with committal at graveside, or the complete service can be performed at any of the aforementioned places without a separate committal. However, you should make your wishes known to your immediate family and/or your lodge secretary. The Masonic service may be held in conjunction with a religious service and/or other fraternal service. It is highly recommended that you: (1) put your wishes in writing, (2) give a copy to the person who will handle your affairs, and (3) place another copy with your will, insurance papers and other valuable documents so that your survivors can clearly comply with your expressed wishes.
