

From The South

Wow how time flies! For those who were able to attend, I hope you enjoyed the January Stated Meeting and the Annual Dinner in honor of Worshipful Christian Moreno. For those who could not make it, be sure to check out the Lodge's web page and Facebook page for some great pictures of your Past Masters and Past Grand Master.

In Masonry we focus a lot on time. Whether it is when we work with the tools in the first and second degrees and again in the third-degree lecture, time plays an im-

portant role. Time is a strange thing. When we want it, there is never enough, but when we want to move forward, it cannot pass fast enough—think back to the last time you sat in your dentist's chair or while waiting for the mechanic to get back to you with an estimate for that car repair you've been putting off. Time remains the same, but it is us and what we bring with us into a moment that changes.

As Masons we are taught to divide our time in hopes that we will be able to accomplish all that needs to be done. But all too often this does not happen. Chores, phone calls, emails get pushed to tomorrow or next week, or just forgotten altogether. And time keeps moving along, never changing, but also never stopping no matter how much we try to manage it.

I have been a Registered Nurse for 26 years. Twenty of those years was spent specializing in hospice care. It will always be the best nursing I've ever done for many reasons. I spent time with patients and their families navigating end of life questions, emotions, and challenges they did not know (or did not want to know) they would face. And of course, the nagging pain of trips not taken, books not read, or adventures left unexplored...there was always going to be another day, a more convenient time, a next time.

I read somewhere recently that one day you reach a point when you have more yesterdays than tomorrows. I paused when I read that. It made me think of things I've been putting off and people I've been meaning to contact. Then I won-

dered if I have been making wise use of my twenty-four-inch gauge and cable tow?

So that is my challenge to you: Ask yourself if you have been able to use your twenty-four-inch gauge? What condition is your cable tow in? Is it stretched so thin that is might snap and send you spinning off into the great unknown? And not just in your Masonic life, but what about your family life? Work life? Recreational life? And every other kind of life that we choose to fill up our time with? It's easy to forget the ancient Master's sentence, "No, I don't have the time."

As I sit in the South, I think of the time we have in Lodge. Whether it be in Stated Meetings, practices, education, or degrees, the time we have with each other is far too short and far too infrequent. We often rush out after a meeting or degree. Can I suggest help picking up the lodge or dining room? So many great conversations are had there. And if there is a brother who you have been thinking about or you've noticed hasn't been in Lodge, give them a call or a text. Meet up for lunch, or just a walk in the park. That might be the contact that you both need. Me? I'm always up for a bike ride.
