

Greetings Brethren!

This year marks the 175th anniversary of San Diego Lodge 35! If those founding brethren came attended our February Stated meeting, how much would they recognize? How much would they find foreign or new? Our meeting format is probably very similar. But what about our ritual?

Ritual is that cement that binds all Masons. It is what allows us to visit other jurisdictions and understand what is happening. Visiting other jurisdictions also allows us to return home and share what we have experienced.

The experiences we have in Masonry stay with us forever. Many of those experiences are because of our Ritual. For Masons, ritual can take two forms: spectating or performing. Our experiences as spectators are also of two types: candidate or sideliner.


As a candidate, we experience the ritual from the inside. The ritual is done to and for us. It becomes our responsibility to understand the lessons that are being imparted.

When we are sideliners, we experience ritual from a different perspective. We know the story, understand the lessons and can re-experience our own time as the candidate.

However, for the candidate, the most important part of the ritual are the performers. Each role in the ritual is important. The candidate
