### The Master's Message

Greetings Brethren! This year is flying by, it's hard to believe it is already June! The summer is approaching much faster than I would like, as I loath the heat, but with it comes some exciting events. As you read this, we may have already completed one or two of the four initiations we have coming up for Zach Perez 5/31, Christian Richter 6/3, Jeremy Paskowski 6/10, and Jermaine Jackson 6/28. To be initiated is the beginning of what can become a life-long journey, so let us start theirs with as much support as possible, each degree will start at 7:00pm, come on down and join us in bringing these candidates from darkness, to see the light by which we work.

Speaking of first degrees, all this preparation has reminded me of an interesting history to the explanation of our aprons. When I was initiated, I heard the phrase "more ancient than the golden fleece or roman eagle; more honorable than the star or garter" and, while I considered myself a student of history, I did not know completely what that meant. Sure, I knew of the Roman Eagle as a symbol of great antiquity, but I knew nothing of the Golden Fleece, nor the Star or Garter.

The Golden Fleece was a Catholic order of knighthood, founded by the Duke of Burgundy in 1430. I can think of at least one masonic artifact that competes with that age, the Regius Poem, considered to be among

the "Old Charges" and dating between 1290 and 1390 depending on the source. So, our fraternity is definitely older than the Golden Fleece, however the claim was about "the lambskin apron" and given the aprons well-travelled history through countless cultures of builders and mystics, it is clear that our humble white aprons do indeed outdate even one of the worlds mightiest empires and its winged symbol.

The Order of the Garter is a chivalric order founded in 1348 by King Edward III of England. It was and still is the most senior order of knighthood, outranked only by two more recent decorations. the Victoria Cross, and the George Cross. The Order of the Star was another chivalric order, born in imitation of the Order of the Garter. I will spare you the details but suffice it to say that these two orders didn't exactly sit on the same side of the fence at this point in history. It is no wonder then, why our ancient brethren choose to assert the honors of our badge over theirs. The Apron being a pure emblem of innocence, service, benevolence, humility, and creation. May we each one of us strive to wear it with honor to the Fraternity.

I look forward to seeing you in lodge.
