

Brethren.

Once the sun came out the days got a lot warmer and we finished the trip at Warner Springs in 85 degree weather.

Bullard at the Grand Secretary and two of our brothers were appointed to chairs in the Grand line. W. Thibodeaux was appointed into the most junior progressive chair as the Grand Royal Arch Captain.
