George Washington proclaimed Thursday, November 26th as a "Day of Public Thanksgiving" following a recommendation by the Federal Congress in 1789. President Franklin Delano Roosevelt proclaimed the "2nd to last Thursday in November" to be recognized as an official national holiday in 1939. Congress followed suit and made the fourth Thursday of each November to be Thanksgiving Day and FDR signed it into law on December 26, 1941.
