It is highly recommended that you: (1) put your wishes in writing, (2) give a copy to the person who will handle your affairs, and (3) place another copy with your will, insurance papers and other valuable documents so that your survivors can clearly comply with your expressed wishes. A note from Doug Ismail, President of the California Masonic Foundation.

"I first met brother Mike George in 2006 or maybe 2007. I still remember his energy, kind smile, generous nature and those sturdy "football player" hands – of course proudly bearing a masonic ring.

In the early days of the development of our Foundation's programs, we depended heavily upon local volunteers to help connect and develop relationships—particularly with our public schools. Mike was on the first Public Schools Advisory Counsel in San Diego—an area where we knew we could continue making a big difference in the lives of kids. Now retired, Mike was at the time a principal—and a lifelong educator and at San Diego Unified Schools. His passion for working with kids was evident from our very first meeting.

Over the years, Mike has helped organize interviews for 100s of high school seniors for our Investment in Success Scholarship program – and Chaired or Vice Chaired the San Diego Public Education Advisory Committee for longer than our records even show! He's also ensured that our Public Schools Celebrations in San Diego are always among the best in the state – often with more than 100 representatives of the community joining our members – where they learn little about what we as masons are doing to support our schools and kids. Mike is a wonderful representative of our Craft – who has always "answered the bell" when it came to helping us with our programs.

We are absolutely certain that without Mike's leadership, we would never be in the strong position we enjoy within San Diego's schools.

Mike is a 38-year member of San Diego No. 35. a Past Potentate of Al Bahr Shrine, and a great person. He and his wife Donna are here today. As a matter of fact, this is Mike's first Annual Communication – and we are honored to present him with this Award today.
