Greetings Brethren,

At the Stated Meeting of September 5<sup>th</sup>, the Treasurer moved and was seconded that the dues of each member of this Lodge be changed from:

"The sum of \$110.00 plus Per Capita sum approved by Grand Lodge at the immediately preceding Annual Communication, with the total thus determined rounded up to the next higher whole multiple of \$1.00 per annum, payable in advance on the first day of January." To:

"The sum of \$130.00 plus the Per Capita sum approved by Grand Lodge at the immediately preceding Annual Communication, with the total thus determined rounded up to the next higher whole multiple of \$1.00 per annum, payable in advance on the first day of January."

The members of this Lodge were notified in writing that this amendment would be voted upon at the stated meeting held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of October, 2025, and that said section was amended by the vote of 2/3s of the members present on that date. This amendment shall have no effect until approved by the Grand Master and if lodge increases its dues, the increase shall become effective upon the start of the fiscal year of the Lodge following the Grand Masters approval of the increase.
